3. We must be active agents of the Kingdom, where we are.

(Matthew 28:19–20) Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age.”

4. We live by pursuing holiness that is attractive, not annoying.

(1 Peter 2:11–12) Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us.
